

Why Reading Really is Magic—Mem Fox

Reading is magical because it brings parents and children together for fun, bonding and giggles. It also helps promote a children's brain, social and language development. Reading aloud to young children, before they reach school age, is especially important to foster a love of books and reading. Children need to hear a thousand stories before they can begin to learn to read. Children learn language from books and reading aloud, more so than learning the alphabet or letter/sound relationships.

It is my firm belief that, if kids know six nursery rhymes by the time they are four, they are more likely to be in the top reading group at school by age eight. It is also part of the reason I decided to write my latest children's book, *Good Night, Sleep Tight*. The book revives seven classic nursery rhymes for new generations. Nursery rhymes and books with a lot of rhyme, rhythm and repetition, help children remember and learn language patterns quicker and more easily. Use the same lively 'tune' every time you read to your child. Children become familiar with books and will better remember the story through this practice.



To make reading 'magical', choose short books that can be read three times in ten minutes. These books should have lots of colour and pictures to stimulate your child's imagination. Playing games with the book, such as letting children finish the rhymes and finding the letters that start with your child's name and yours helps them focus on the things on the page.

Always make reading books to your children the last thing you do before their bedtime to help them relax at the end of the day. Having said that, reading can happen nicely at any time of the day, particularly when children are tired or fractious: it's a calming thing to do, and very loving. But it's not just about your reading; your presence is what's most important to a child.

Parking around the School

Just a friendly reminder to all families who drop off and collect their children each day as the parking rangers have apparently been sighted patrolling the school area of late. Although these patrols are random and irregular, the rangers do drive by and patrol school areas within the Tweed Shire to ensure the safety of all students. The parking zones directly in front of the school are classified as 'No Stopping' Zones between 8.00 - 9.30am and 2.30 - 4.00pm. This also includes 15 metres either side of the school pedestrian / flag crossing area. The school has no control over these areas and parking there is at your own risk. The best way to avoid receiving a fine is to ensure that you park in the correct sign posted area or to promptly collect your child/ren and ensure that you have departed that area by 2.30pm.

Free Student Sports & Creative Vouchers

The NSW Government is helping kids get active with the Active Kids and Creative Kids program. The Active Kids program provides two \$100 vouchers for parents, guardians and carers of school-enrolled children to use towards sport and active recreation costs each year. These are not means tested so anyone can apply.

From 1 July 2019, parents, guardians and carers can apply for the second \$100 Active Kids voucher which equates to \$200 per child per year. Each year you can also apply for one \$100 Creative Kids youcher for art, music, theatre, circus etc. Voucher 1 is valid January to December and Voucher 2 is valid July to December and this one is out now. The vouchers may be used with a registered activity provider for registration, participation and membership costs for sport, fitness and active recreation activities.

To use a voucher, find a registered activity provider and present your voucher when you sign up. The Active Kids program is one of more than 70 NSW Government rebates and savings that help with your cost of living.
